RESEARCH

I study migrant farmworker youth as a discrete model for understanding the mental health and socioemotional consequences of alternative (non-typical) pathways to adulthood. Specifically, I focus on the unique circumstantial and cultural stressors experienced by immigrant youth in the U.S. without adult supervision (i.e., loneliness, social isolation, perceived stress, food insecurity) and the respective health and developmental implications of migrant youth's "adult-like" behavior. I apply quantitative, qualitative, and mixed-methods in my research.
