Getting Ready for Kindergarten: A Guide for Parents and Teachers

It is never too early to start building the skills your child needs to succeed. This list of examples will help. Put a check next to the skills you already see in your child. Then work on the ones you did not check. Don't expect to be able to check them all. Every child develops at his or her own pace. Your child may reach these milestones slightly before or after other children the same age. That's why this checklist should not be used to decide whether to enroll your child in kindergarten. The list should be used to work on skills that will make the transition to school easier. You greeted your baby's first day of life with a smile. Now the two of you can greet the first day of school the same way.
